

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Today is designated by the Church as the “Day for Life” a time to reflect on the dignity of life from conception to natural death. Today marks too the end of the Season of Creation, a time to remember that we are protectors of this earth and have been given responsibility to care for it, not to plunder and destroy it. And today is also the feast of St Francis of Assisi, who as a mystic and a poet, saw how intimately connected everything in this world really is.

During the days of lockdown many people became more aware of the simple things in life - the beauty of birdsong, the splendour of creation, the variety of trees and shrubs, the formation of the clouds, the myriad of stars at night and a sense of the earth resting. Pope Francis says that this deeper awareness, “takes us to the heart of what it is to be human” and gives us an opportunity to regain a sense of wonder and awe for all God’s creation.

The Mass readings this weekend share a common image found in the scriptures, namely that of the vineyard. All three readings are one in their challenge and encouragement for us to live a life worthy of the Gospel. We are given responsibility by the landowner who leaves the vineyard to our care and creativity. We are encouraged to bear good fruit, to be decent, loving people who create a world in which justice will flourish and peace can be enjoyed by all. The last few verses of St Paul's letter to the Philippians sum up the kind of fruit God wants, "Fill your minds with everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure.....then the God of peace will be with you".

And finally, in these days when our world continues to face the challenges of the coronavirus pandemic, the Holy Father asks us to "pray for all those families, volunteers and healthcare professionals committed, often heroically, to the care and healing of the suffering, and for all those who, amid the continuing 'pandemic' of poverty and war, work to uphold the God-given value and dignity of every human person."
