

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

I sometimes try to imagine the terrible loneliness of the ‘American Wake’ of years gone by. So many of our people had to emigrate from every county in Ireland to the United States and other parts of the world, knowing that they might never return. In those days they had little means of communication, so the farewell party on the eve of departure was indeed equivalent to a wake.

Today’s gospel is also a story of farewell and departure. It is taken from a section of St John’s gospel known as ‘The Farewell Discourse’. The setting is the Last Supper, the night before Jesus’ crucifixion. For a group of people who had become dependent on him as leader and friend, they must have felt lonely and bewildered. Not only were they engulfed by the sadness of his impending death, but they were overwhelmed by a terrible sense of confusion and

emptiness. The uncertainty of a future without Jesus disturbed them deeply.

With great gentleness and compassion, Jesus reassures them of the special relationship he has with them, “You are my friends...You did not choose me, no, I chose you. What I command you is to love one another.....the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name”.

The intimacy of that relationship will be fortified with the coming of the Holy Spirit, who is called the Advocate and Helper. During our own times of uncertainty and confusion, and especially in our moments of personal loneliness and fear, let us remind ourselves that Jesus has promised us the same Advocate to be with us as Comforter and Consoler.

According to the Gospel reading, what the Lord asks of us in return is that we love him by keeping his commandments: “If you love me you will keep my commandments.” We are called to be immersed in a culture of kindness and to have the living expression of God’s goodness reflected in all that we do and say. Yet we know from experience that love and friendship make demands on us. Parents, for example, give freely of their time and energy to caring for their children, but it often requires great effort and much sacrifice. In responding to the needs of friends or spouses, people can be challenged to ‘lay down’ their own ‘lives’ at least for a time, so that something better can be achieved. You might like to recall a time when putting yourself out for others bore fruit for them and for you.
