*“You entrusted me with two talents;  
here are two more that I have made”*

**Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,**

Today we have another parable about the Kingdom of God; on this occasion Jesus tells a story about a man entrusting his three servants with a varying number of talents. When he later asks them to give an account of their progress, our attention is focused on the third servant who simply buried his talent in the ground with the result he had nothing to show.

At the time of Jesus, a talent was a unit of currency, whereas we might be inclined to think of a talent as a personal ability or a special gift, like being able to play football or sing. And while we have a responsibility to develop all such talents, it would be a mistake to think that Jesus was advocating financial success or encouraging material gain. In keeping with many parables, the meaning is deeper than first appears. It may have to do with living wisely, like the woman in the First reading, doing what is right and developing ourselves to become what God wants us to be. Every person is talented - what matters is not what people's talents are, but how we use them in the service of promoting the Kingdom of God.

In the final analysis, the parable of the talents is all about love. Life is God's gift to us. What we do with life is our gift to God.

## **Commemoration of our Dead**

It has been the custom to come together in the month of November to remember our dead and pray particularly for those who have died since this time last year. Because of the current circumstances relating to Covid-19, I would like to propose an alternative format for this year's memorial prayer service.

There have been 24 deaths/burials in Beragh parish during the past twelve months. On Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> November we will celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, the last Sunday in the Church's year. On that day there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Beragh from 2.00 pm until 5.00 pm.

During each half hour period we will pray specially for four people from the list of those who have died, beginning 1<sup>st</sup> November 2019. Family and friends of those people will be invited to come at that time, if they wish to do so. All other parishioners are invited to come and pray at any time. The specific details of names and times will be published later and the next of kin will also be informed.
