

**Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,**

There's a story told that all the people who ever lived were assembled before the throne of Christ the King. They all had complaints and were murmuring among themselves. One of the groups was composed of Jews who had suffered persecution. Some had died in gas chambers and concentration camps - and they grumbled bitterly: how could God know of the unmentionable sufferings they had been through? Another group were slaves - black men and women who had endured terrible indignities: what could God know about their plight? There were long lines of refugees driven from their homelands - homeless people who had nowhere to lay their heads. And there were poor people, who had never on this earth been able to make ends meet.

There were sick people and those who had suffered all kinds of disease and disability; hundreds of groups, each with a complaint against God.

From each group a leader was chosen, and a commission appointed to draw up the case against the Almighty himself. Instead of God judging them, they began judging God. Eventually, after much discussion the verdict was agreed: taking into account all that people had endured, they reckoned that God should be sentenced to live on earth as a human being with no safeguards to protect his divinity.

Let him be born a Jew. Let him be born poor. Let even the legitimacy of his birth be suspect. Let poverty be his lifestyle and for friends give him only those who are held in contempt. Let him wander the roads as a homeless itinerant. Let him be betrayed by one of his friends. Let him be indicted of false charges, tried before a prejudiced jury and convicted by a cowardly judge. Let him be abandoned by his friends so that he may know what it is to be utterly alone. Let him be tortured with every cruel means imaginable and then let him die like a criminal in the full gaze of a vulgar public.

As each group announced its sentence on God, roars of approval went up from the throng. When the last had finished, the raucous noise had become almost deafening.... And then everyone turned towards the throne. And suddenly the place was filled with shocked and penitent silence. For where there had been a throne, now could be seen a cross with the mangled body of Jesus Christ stretched upon it.

“We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world”.

## **Face Coverings in Churches**

Thank you for continuing to ensure that our celebration of Mass and other Liturgies remain safe places for all who join us. It has been acknowledged that the wearing of face masks, in conjunction with hand washing and social distancing etc are likely to reduce the spread of Coronavirus, thus helping to protect others and ourselves. While the government has not formally made it mandatory, all Church leaders strongly recommend that people attending church should wear face coverings, with the exception of those people considered exempt and children under the age of 13.

## Help protect babies with cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot

Sadly, abortion is currently available in the UK, right up to birth, for babies with cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot. All of these conditions can be corrected.

A cross-party group of MPs from the three largest parties in the UK Parliament have come together to bring forward the Abortion (Cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot) Bill. The Bill will change the law to clarify that cleft palate, cleft lip, and club foot are not grounds for abortion in the UK.
