Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Today's feast of Pentecost celebrates the transforming power of God's Holy Spirit and the associated gifts of peace, courage and love.

In recent times countless people have felt ashamed and disillusioned by many of the institutions and the people they once trusted - the church, the banks, governments and politicians. Fear rises in the hearts of those who are sick and elderly as they wonder will anybody care for them in the years ahead. A sense of hopelessness grows in the hearts of many young people who cannot see where they will find work or manage to cope with a changing economy. Anger is deep in the hearts of the deprived, the poor and the redundant who see the rich getting richer. Apathy leads to more widespread dependency on alcohol and drugs as the perceived way to cope. What joy could the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost have for such a beleaguered people? How can today's liturgy have any relevance for real life?

I believe there are similarities and comparisons with society at the time of the first Pentecost. Back then Palestine was oppressed and worse was coming with the destruction of Jerusalem. There seemed to be no hope politically, economically or even religiously. Peter and the others must have longed to be back in the old days of a few years previous when they had little financially but were secure in their humdrum lives. However, there was no going back! Instead, the Spirit of God came upon them and from being frightened, despondent cowards, they became people of hope and courage ready to step out and build a better world for all God's people. Those first steps seemed insignificant, but they sowed the seeds of faith in Jesus as Risen Lord. From there it spread through the world and through the ages. The achievements of Francis of Assisi, Vincent de Paul, Mother Teresa and millions of other followers of Christ stem from that first Pentecost.

Today we celebrate the coming of the same Spirit on us, Christ's disciples of our time. Will this coming mark a new beginning in our lives? Everybody wants to change the world, but few want to change themselves. Pentecost is an invitation and an opportunity to let God's Spirit transform our hearts and renew the face of the earth.

### Prayer to the Holy Spirit

Come, Holy Spirit, fill my heart with your holy gifts.

Assist me, O Holy Spirit, in all my trials of life.

Enlighten me in my ignorance.

Advise me in my doubts.

Strengthen me in my weakness.

Help me in my needs.

Protect me in temptation and console me in afflictions.

After the savage brutality of Calvary had destroyed an innocent and good friend, the disciples had locked themselves away from their enemies and even from their friends. But then, much to their surprise, they are transformed by a spirit of creative love that heals hurt and unravels the web of fear that ensnares wounded hearts.

Strengthened by the power of God's Holy Spirit, the disciples go out to the world to proclaim forgiveness and hope. Every hurt they forgive is healed through the power of God. Every hope they enkindle is fanned in to flame by the Spirit of God. This was the stupendous mystery of the first Pentecost; this is what we celebrate today. The Lord continues to send the same healing Spirit into our hearts and asks us to be wounded healers to others.
