

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Parents get excited when their baby speaks its first words. Nowadays, such moments are often recorded and shared proudly on social media. Beginning to speak is an important stage in any child's development and reminds us of the unique gift that belongs to the human person.

Today's readings tell us that a person's conversation is the real test of character because a person's words flow out from what fills the heart. Each evening it would be a useful exercise to recall the words we have spoken and the conversations we have engaged in throughout the day to alert us to what goodness is within us, and what needs healing and forgiveness, what bitterness needs attention, what bridges need to be rebuilt, what love needs to be nurtured, and what peace needs to be restored. Words are rarely neutral. Words tend to build up or destroy, to cause pain or joy, to damage or affirm. As the First Reading states, "The test of a person is in their conversation." The words we use can be a mirror to show us what we are, while God's word is a beacon to show us what we can become. In the same gospel Jesus reminds us that we should bear good fruit - a rotten tree is useless. The fruits that we need to produce are those suggested by

St Paul: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. As we begin the Season of Lent, it might be a useful exercise to take each of those nine fruits and sow a little seed of each one every day during the coming weeks. One day at a time and one seed at a time.

A Day of Prayer for Temperance Sunday

Today is Temperance Sunday. On this day we pray for the virtue of moderation. I read recently that back in 1956 Pope Pius xii addressed a group of Garda Siochana, who were also pioneers. On that occasion the Pope made the remark that Ireland is a land that combines the smile and the tear. I think it's an interesting description. Irish people have indeed been renowned for their hospitality and for their sense of humour. But sadly, we are also renowned for excessive drinking. In the past the Irish were inclined to drown their sorrows; today we are more able to indulge ourselves.

As we begin the season of Lent, I think we could borrow something from the ideals of those who are full pioneers. Like them, we could try to abstain from alcohol for the coming weeks, simply to give glory to God, to give good example to others especially our children, to practice self-denial, to make reparation for the sins of intemperance and for the conversion of excessive drinkers.

I wish to thank those people who made contact requesting a visit to a number of parishioners who are presently confined. In keeping with Covid 19 regulations, I will attend people in their homes over the coming weeks.

Returning to regular Mass schedule

As mentioned last Sunday, the previous Mass arrangements for the three chapels will come into effect on the weekend $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$ April. In preparation for that, I am inviting a small group of volunteers in Drumduff and Seskinore to form as Covid 19 teams to look after sanitising protocols, as practiced in Beragh chapel. There will be a meeting next week to discuss the details.

In His Master's Footsteps

During "Lockdown" Canon Benny Fee, Parish Priest of Clonoe parish produced a beautiful Way of the Cross based on the writings of St Oliver Plunkett.
