**Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,**

Before a president or a prime minister take office, they usually give their inaugural speech. They outline their policies and speak about what they hope to achieve during their term of office. In today's Gospel something similar happens when Jesus stands up in the synagogue at Nazareth. He reads a passage from the prophet Isaiah to indicate the spirit of his ministry; it is radical, and it is revolutionary - it is good news for the oppressed and the afflicted. Jesus states that his concern will be with the poor, the blind, the troubled and those in captivity; there will be a social dimension to his ministry.

And so it was. All during his ministry Jesus showed a consistent concern for those people who lived on the margins of society and life. He has a vision of a new social order based on service and humility. As it states in one of the Mass Prefaces: "He always showed compassion for children and the poor, for the sick and for sinners, and he became a neighbour to the oppressed and the afflicted".

In our own time that same need is very real. Television and other media platforms allow us to be haunted by the terrible reality of injustice, poverty, famine, and climate disaster. As Christians we believe that God cannot abide any one of his children being oppressed or disadvantaged; each human person has a radical dignity because Christ lived, died, and rose to new life for all of us. As the same Preface concludes: "By word and deed Jesus announced to the world that God is our Father and that he cares for all his sons and daughters".

When the gospel speaks of the poor, we are thinking of more than those who are without money. The poor includes all those who are wounded by life in any way, the little ones who are weighed down by difficult circumstances and those who wish to be unburdened. Above all, the poor are those people who recognise that all is not well and are prepared to admit their need for salvation and healing. The Pharisees did not have that attitude; they were so bloated by their own pride and self-importance that they felt they had no need for redemption.

One of the challenges we face is that of discouragement; the canvas of problems can be so enormous that we might fear we can do nothing about them. It's a bit like when Mother Theresa of Calcutta was once asked by a high-ranking government official: "How are you going to feed ten thousand hungry people?". She replied, "One by one". Each person has the responsibility to make the vision of Jesus a reality. It may be little, but it can be a start.

## **Covid 19 Wakes and Funerals**

When a person has died as a result of Covid 19, new regulations governing arrangements for wakes and funerals have come into effect from September 2021. Where there is a negligible risk of transmitting the Covid 19 infection, the remains of the deceased are allowed to be taken home and viewing is permitted. They can also be brought to the church for the funeral Mass. However, the regulations regarding numbers permitted to gather, social distancing, hand hygiene and face coverings must be observed. Anyone who has had a positive Covid 19 test result or anyone who is symptomatic should not attend.

## **Week-end Masses**

I am aware that some people in the parish are quite annoyed there is no Mass in St Malachy's, Seskinore on Sunday and no Mass in St Patrick's, Drumduff on Saturday evening, as was the practice in recent years. I share their disappointment, but unfortunately the situation is outside my control. I would love to be able to reinstate the arrangements we had prior to Covid-19. However, the current regulations regarding places of worship are determined, not by numbers in attendance, but by capacity. It is the responsibility of the parish to ensure that the building can safely accommodate people by ensuring the stipulated social distancing, in addition to the other protocols regarding signage, ventilation, and sanitisation etc. Given the size of Seskinore and Drumduff churches, it is not possible to have public week-end Masses until the Health Authorities and the Executive relax the present guidelines.

## Covid-19

While the Executive has decided to ease the restriction of face coverings in places of worship, Church leaders are encouraging people to continue to use them as a precautionary measure against the spread of infection.
