Postcards for the Assisted Suicide Vote

The assisted suicide Bill will be voted on again in Parliament in Westminster on 11 September. Although this Bill would change the law in England and Wales, MPs in Northern Ireland are able to vote on this Bill. If assisted suicide is legalised in England and Wales, this will put pressure on Northern Irish lawmakers to legalise assisted suicide in Northern Ireland too, to keep UK legislation consistent on this issue. You are encouraged to write to your local MP asking them to vote against the legislation of assisted suicide in the parliamentary vote in Westminster on 11 September. To this end, pre-printed postcards are available at the back of the church. Please take a postcard and send it to your local MP in advance of the vote.
